Christopher Michael DeShazo, affectionately known as “Chrissy Bugs” or “Handsome,” was born on January 30, 1976, in Butte, Montana, to Marcia (Crowley) DeShazo and the late Ken DeShazo.

Chris attended Emerson Grade School, East Junior High, and graduated with the Butte High School Class of 1995. During his school years, he played football, made countless friends, and was always surrounded by laughter. His beautiful smile, quick wit, and warm, loving personality made him a lifelong friend to many. You couldn’t ask for a sweeter, more loyal, or more protective soul.

After high school, Chris attended a trade school in Arizona for diesel mechanics before beginning work with O’Keefe Drilling in Winnemucca, Nevada, as a driller’s helper. There, he worked proudly alongside his uncle Jim and cousins Matt and Mike — a job he truly enjoyed, made even more meaningful by sharing it with family.

In 2000, Chris suffered injuries from a tragic accident that left him impaired and unable to continue working. But that never stopped him from living fully. His spirit remained strong, his heart open, and his presence a gift to everyone he met.

Chris loved playing pool—his famous bank shot was legendary—and he enjoyed riding his bike, playing golf, going for rides, collecting treasures, picking up cans, visiting with friends and family, and helping out on any project he could. He had an uncanny ability to find joy in the simple things and to bring that joy to others.

Even after his accident, Chris's light never dimmed. He remained a strong, kindhearted, and generous soul who believed in helping everyone he met. There was never a stranger to Chris—only friends he hadn't yet made. His giving nature led him to open his home to those in need, often offering shelter to the homeless.

Above all, Chris loved his family, his animals, and his loyal companion, Rowdy, his German Shepherd. His life serves as a reminder to be kind to everyone we meet, as each of us carries unseen chapters.

Chris was preceded in death by his father, Ken DeShazo; grandparents Vi and Dick DeShazo, and Elmer and Marie Crowley; uncles Ernie and Mike DeShazo and Larry Crowley; aunts Judy Kelly, Darlene Hale, and Carol Jean Wickham; and cousins Jimmy Anderson and Sara Crowley.

He is survived by his loving mother, Marcia DeShazo; brothers Brad and Kenny DeShazo; sister Ashley DeShazo; daughter Mistyn Price; grandsons Kash and Dane; and granddaughter Catalina, expected to arrive soon. He also leaves behind his beloved nieces and nephews—Hannah Jo, Maddie, Brandon, Vi, Trinity, Kenny, Gracelynn and Christopher.

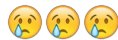
