Diane was born in Butte to Julius and June Vanina on February 7, 1946 and raised on the family ranch in Elk Park. Having a love for all animals, she kept very busy and enjoyed the ranch life. It was there she met and fell in love with Don Thomas who worked for her folks. They were married on September 11, 1964 and had three children, Mike, Cindy and Lisa. She and Donny were married for 24 years and as Donny's health failed due to ALS (Lou Gehrig's Disease), she became his caregiver and what a wonderful job she did. Through the use of lifts and special equipment she single-handedly cared for him at home until this devastating and debilitating disease took his life on March 18, 1988.

She and Larry Dunville fell head over heels in love and on April 10, 2003 they were the first couple to get married at the Belmont. She and her husband enjoyed 17 years of marital bliss until his passing 2 years ago due to respiratory complications. Again she was meticulous in everything she did for Larry.
