



## Floyd Leo Saylor

January 25, 1931 - February 18, 2025

Floyd Leo Saylor passed away Tuesday, February 18, 2025 at his home in Butte. He was born in Garrison, North Dakota to Carl and Kathryn (Wetzel) Sunday, January 25, 1931 on the Saylor farm that to this day remains privately owned by the Saylor family. Floyd was educated in Garrison and was a Golden Glove boxer in his youth.

He joined the United States Marine Corp during the Korean Conflict and was stationed in Santa Ana, California.

He married Dolores Aguirre on August 2, 1953 in Butte and started his work history as an accountant for Safeway. Then he decided to spend his life working in the mechanic field at Highland Motors, Wilson Motors and eventually the Anaconda Mineral Company. During strikes he traveled to many places to work. His wife and he bought and ran the Miners Market for several years, shutting it down when small grocery stores were no longer fashionable. When the company shut down, he lived in a camper to spend some time in Canyon, Yellowstone National Park as a maintenance worker. Eventually he retired from the Crest Nursing Home. He built three homes around Butte.

Floyd had nine brothers and sister, all preceding him in death, Alvina Buchanan, Art Saylor, Stella Wiehle, Elsie Saylor, Ruth Winn, Howard Saylor, Alpha Pericich, Doris Steinwand and Leona Hausauer.

He is survived by his wife of over 71 years, Dolores Saylor, four children, seven grandchildren and three-great-grandchildren: Floyd "Cubby" and Patty

Sayler, Andrew (Matthias, Ananais, Israel) Brittnee Sayler, Tiffanie Sayler and Tony Brunty; Ron Sayler; Shauna and Rick Herrera, Analeisa, Stefano', Collette Lockwood, Michala and Brennan Hilgen, (Myla, Callie, Lucianna) Kiersten Lockwood.
