December 4, 1928 - February 5, 2017

Mr. Guy L. Palmer passed away peacefully and suddenly Sunday morning at his home west of Butte. He was born in Cresbard, South Dakota on December 4, 1928 to Lawrence G. and Nellie (Thompson) Palmer. He attended schools in that area and came to Butte as a young man with his family and worked underground mines, as did his father.

He and Delores I. Cor were married in Emmanuel Lutheran Church here in Butte on May 17, 1949. She passed away March 28, 2010.

Guy left the mines and worked in Burrs Dept. Store, and later the Montana Standard as advertising and circulation manager. He and his partner owned one of the first unlimited outfitter licenses in Montana. Hunting and fishing were always a huge part of his life. He instilled a great love for the outdoors in his children and wife. Guy and Delores collected antiques and evolved into antique dealers, which was their occupation right into their last days.
