



Kimberley Anne MacHardy

Kimberly Anne MacHardy passed away Tuesday, October 26, 2021 at her home in Butte. She was born Sunday, January 5, 1964 in Halifax, Nova Scotia to Fraser Stewart and Betty May (Rieser) MacHardy. She graduated from Sir John A. MacDonald High School in Nova Scotia and earned her Bachelors Degree of Fine Arts with a major in jewelry and minor in art history from Nova Scotia College of Art and Design in Halifax.

Kimberley lived in several different communities and had several jobs before moving to Butte where she earned her Master's Degree in Geosciences from Montana Tech. She was hired by the Montana Department of Transportation in 2006 as a lab technician in Butte and then transferred to Helena as a Materials Specialist, retiring in 2021.

Kimberley was a founding member of the Main Stope Gallery in Butte where she showcased many beautiful pieces of jewelry designed and created by her. She was also the sole proprietor of Personal Paradigms Jewelry. She was a member of the Mile High Nordic Ski Club, now the Mile High Nordic Ski Education Foundation and the Little Basin Creek Volunteer Fire Department. Kimberley enjoyed the outdoors and loved her horses and was an inspiration to all who met her. She is survived by her partner, best friend and love of her life, Christopher Johnson of Butte. Also surviving are her father, Stewart MacHardy and her brothers, Alan MacHardy, Jamie MacHardy, Thomas MacHardy and David MacHardy.

Cremation has taken place. A celebration of her life will be held Friday

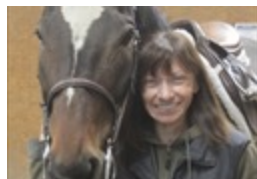
