Devoted Christian, wife, mom, grandma, and great-grandma, Shirley Agnes Farrow, died on March 29, 2019 in Butte, Montana. She was born in Butte on September 29, 1930 to Hubert and Agnes Erwin. She attended Monroe Elementary School, graduated from Butte High School in 1947, and continued her education at Butte Business College. Her career as a bookkeeper began at MF Patterson Dental Supply. Shirley met her beloved husband, Ted Farrow, in a hospital room she shared with his sister, Francie. They married on June 4, 1950, and together they raised three children, Rhonda, Rande, and Rodd. Once the children were all in school, Shirley resumed her career as a bookkeeper, working alongside Ted at Pioneer Concrete & Fuel for many years. They retired together in small steps by spending more time each year enjoying motorhome trips throughout the western United States, including a trip to Alaska.

The Lutheran church played a key role in Shirley's formative years as she and her sister, Doris, held hands to venture across Montana Street on Sunday mornings to a Lutheran church near their childhood home. Later on, she became a lifetime member of Gold Hill Lutheran Church, and devoted her life to serving the Lord and others. Besides working closely with Ted to support him in his career, she was interested in every aspect of the education and career pursuits of her children and grandchildren. Her support included volunteer work in children's ministries at Gold Hill, PTA, Scouts, and 4-H.

Shirley was also devoted to nurturing extended family relationships with her frequent phone calls and hand-written letters and cards. In addition, Shirley maintained close relationships with high school friends who became her lifelong “Forever Friends” (Laverne Henrich, Dorothy Kohler, Dorothy McKinnon, Olive Pierce, and Lorraine Pengelly). Shirley used her creativity and sewing skills to serve others as well. She was involved in sewing projects at church, shared her sewing expertise with 4-H girls, and even made matching shirts for her family of five to better keep track of everyone on a Disneyland vacation.

An avid reader her entire life, Shirley had a lifelong love of learning. Delving into the Scriptures during Women’s Bible studies at Gold Hill Lutheran Church played a key role in her spiritual learning. She never let go of her childhood desire to learn to play the piano, and she fulfilled that dream after her children were raised. She was quick to become computer savvy, as she computerized Pioneer’s bookkeeping system and learned to word process business letters and letters to family and friends. Blessed with an adventurous spirit, Shirley was always eager to engage in a wide variety of activities whenever family or friends were involved. Throughout the years, she enjoyed outdoor adventures such as camping, boating, water skiing, swimming, bicycling, motorcycling, snowmobiling, and snow skiing. Playing cards was a favorite indoor activity. She often won family pinochle games, and developed into a highly competitive member of the Jolley Bridge Club. Later in life, she started playing panguingue as well.
